SECOND ROUND OF WINNERS ANNOUNCED IN **BOWLING CENTER ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN AWARDS**

BCM Honors Hybrid and Traditional Centers With Inaugural BCMmy Awards

ARLINGTON, Texas - The second round of winners in the 37th annual Bowling Center Architecture and Design Awards has been unveiled by Bowling Center Management magazine. Each will receive one of the inaugural BCMmy Awards.

The awards feature projects completed between Oct. 17, 2020, and Dec. 31, 2021. Although that period coincided with part of the COVID-19 pandemic, the competition still attracted 50 entries from 18 countries.
